



Year 7 Catch Up Funding Plan 2017/18

The literacy and numeracy **catch-up premium** gives state-funded schools, including special schools and alternative provision settings, additional **funding** to support **year 7** pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

The following outlines our plans for how we will spend our allocated money to support these students:

The national average for students achieving 'expected standard' in reading in 2016/17 was 75%. At Raine's 75% of our intake achieved 'expected standard'.

The national average for students achieving 'expected standard' in Maths 2016/17 was 76%. At Raine's 80% of our intake achieved 'expected standard'.

The national figure for students achieving the 'expected standard' in all 3 elements of reading, writing and Maths for 2016/17 year was 61%. At Raine's 60% of our intake achieved 'expected standard' in all three elements of reading, writing and Maths.

A number of other students joined us without any prior data. Of these students our internal assessments suggested that 75% were working at the 'expected standard'.

Of those students that were targeted for catch up funding 93% made either expected or above expected progress by the end of the year.
